





Community Affairs

2017 key achievements

- Ruwwad meets on a by weekly basis with 18 local council members, 12 youth local council members (majority of whom are Ruwwad friends and graduates)
- Developed partnerships to launch vocational track# 40 Youth beneficiaries: Amoun (12),
 Hotels(12) Vocational Training Center (4), AlQuds Culinary & clothes design (12)
- Building relationships with 120 Youth graduates from Ruwwad Nathif \Mareekh, only 35 live in the area.
- we enabled **150** children who dropped out of school to go back to their schools by providing family and psychosocial support
- 30 children aged 6-8 enrolled in school within the system of admission and direct enrollment
- 26 children aged 9-12 enrolled in the remedial education system
- 69 children aged 13 20 enrolled in popular education program MOE to ensure they can work and continue education (quest scope)



Community Organizing

Campaigns 2017 Deliverables

Al Jana Campaign will organize 50 community organizers to disseminate the learning kits that include better parenting practices, legal awareness and leadership practices of the 6 minutes, Safe Homes and For Your Sake child protection campaigns to 500 women and youth











Al Jana Community Led Campaign for Child protection enabled:



- 2 leadership teams
- 29 members in 1st tier 39 members in 2nd tier=60 organizers
- 10 Senior educator facilitators
- 301 beneficiaries from educational sessions end of December 2017



Resulted in a team of adolescents that performs the Bedouin heritage through the art of dance. There are 8 members in the group








